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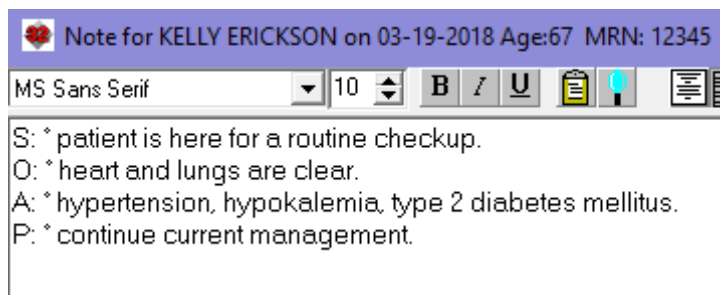
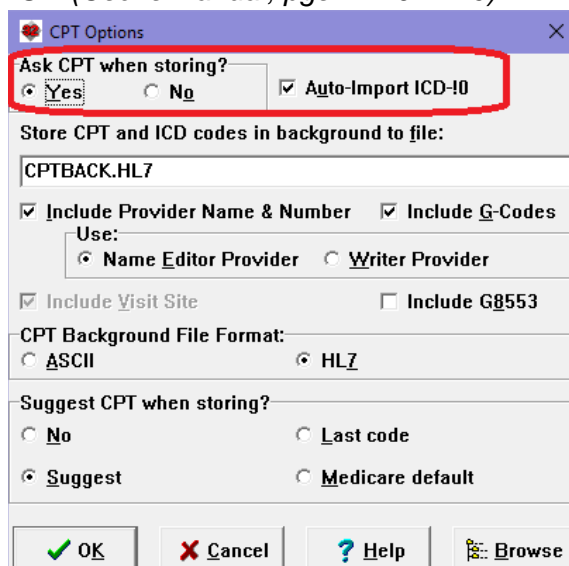
## PROCEDURE CODE AUTO IMPORT ICD 10 OPTION (User's Manual, pgs. 1419-1420)

You could arrange for the program to automatically import the ICD-10 codes corresponding to the diagnoses mentioned in your note into the CPT Code Editor when you store a note, so that these codes are included with the CPT Code Report. Let's see how to do this:

1. Press Libraries\Procedure Codes\Options.
2. Check **Ask CPT When Storing?** and **Auto Import ICD-10**.
3. Press **OK**.

Now, let's try writing a note:

1. Press Write\New Note\Note.
2. Enter the name of the patient, such as Kelly Erickson and press **OK**.
3. Enter the date of the note and press **OK**.
4. Type in the following note in the Writer:



5. Press <F10> to store the note.
6. Specify the Type of Visit as Management and press **OK**.
7. Designate the CPT code for this visit, such as 99213.
8. Note that the ICD-10 codes for the diagnoses mentioned in your note (Hypertension equals I10, hypokalemia equals E87.6, and type II diabetes equals E11.9), have been automatically inserted into the ICD Codes box for you. You can feel free to edit this list before pressing **OK** to store the CPT and ICD 10 coding for this visit.

## APRIL QUARTERLY UPDATE RELEASED

This month we are releasing the January, 2018 Quarterly Update.
